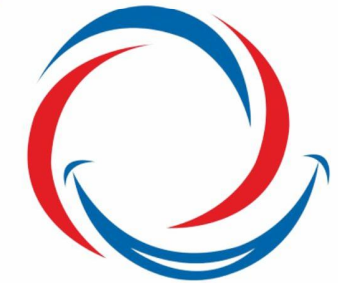

On the onset of COVID pandemic we launched Indian Sign Language (ISL) based online education for Deaf children in the academic year 2021-22. The response to our initiative was so overwhelming, the short term subject enrichment training programs such as English, ISL, Maths, General Knowledge continued into the academic year 2022-23. From the observations we made during the online teaching - learning process, we are happy to note that deaf children were quite adaptable and responsive to newer teaching and learning conditions; their knowledge base grew faster and were age-appropriate, i.e., closely on par with hearing children which was unlike of Deaf children from previous generations. We, as deaf children of our times, were late learners because of inaccessible educational contents and non-availability of Deaf role models before us. The experience has led us to believe in the power of ISL based bilingual - bicultural (bi-bi) education imparted by Deaf teachers to deaf children. The team of Orjet Foundation has taken a firm stand to promote ISL based bi-bi education and to work with Deaf organisations to advocate for deaf rights to accessible education in schools for the deaf in India.

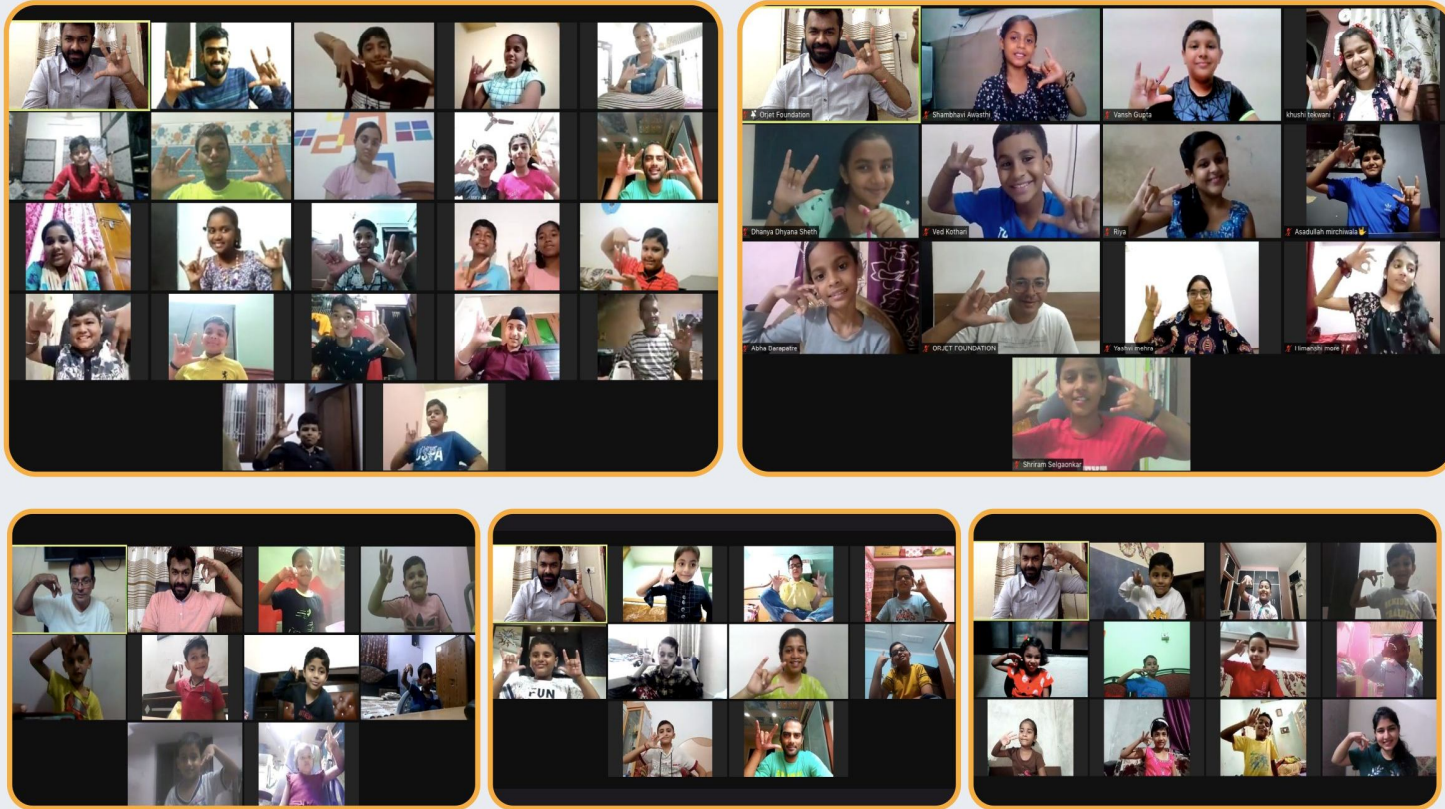

ONLINE EDUCATION & TRAINING

Online Education for Deaf Children



We started this journey during the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 which had brought on the inevitable - temporary closure of schools and the intervention of an online education. Closure of schools had impacted education of deaf children. Deaf children were worst hit because did not have the access to spoken communication / discourses presented on the online educational platforms. The team of Orjet Foundation saw the opportunity in disguise. It decided to introduce ISL based online education to develop cognitive and communication skills among Deaf children since the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 formally recommended the use of Indian Sign Language (ISL) as the medium of communication and instruction for children with hearing impairment.

Even though the situation is returning to normal after 3 years of COVID – 19 pandemic, that is schools for the deaf have reopened, Orjet has firmly decided to continue imparting education through ISL owing to overwhelming response to our online education program from young deaf children. The deaf children enthusiastically participated in our online education program activities after school hours. Learning performance of Orjet's deaf children had visibly improved over time. Till date, a total of 84 deaf students from urban and rural areas of different Indian States participated in our online education program. The team of Orjet Foundation has determined to exploit its limited resources to help more and more deaf children get the online education.

- OUR STAR PROJECT

Guidance and Counselling for Deaf Parents of Deaf Children



We all know that parents of deaf children play a crucial role in the overall development and well-being of deaf children. Orjet Foundation conducted weekly workshop online for three months to provide guidance and counselling to Deaf parents of Deaf children. They ask different questions related to the teaching and learning process, cognitive and behavioural development in their deaf children, and building healthy relationships between them. They are guided and counselled by able Deaf experts. Orjet Foundation invited senior Deaf parent Mr. Chandramouli KS (B.Com) as guest to the workshop to share his experiences with other deaf parents of deaf children on raising his academically successful deaf son Deepak, B.Sc. (Computer Science). Manan Shah (B.A.) also shared with them some invaluable tips on how to interact with deaf children by engaging in meaningful conversation while teaching subject knowledge.

A message from Chandramouli KS (Bengaluru)



As the deaf persons, my wife, Asha MR and I are using Sign language besides English, the written language. Sometimes we're using total communication ie, lip movement + Sign language simultaneously.

As the parents of a deaf child, we believe that the best method to educate Deaf children is bilingualism (written language + sign language) Lip-movement can be used.

My wife and I talk in natural Sign language in the presence of our kid, Deepak KC. We started educating the kid in bilingual language with the help of books that contain visual pictures and words. He learnt many things very fast. And he could write well. As the homework (or exercise) was concerned, he had to read books, understand all subjects with parents' help and to do the homework under parents' supervision. As a result, he could keep pace with the "hearing" child. From our experiences, the parents' involvement in deaf children's education and growth is of paramount importance! And the children will surely lead normal lives in the society.

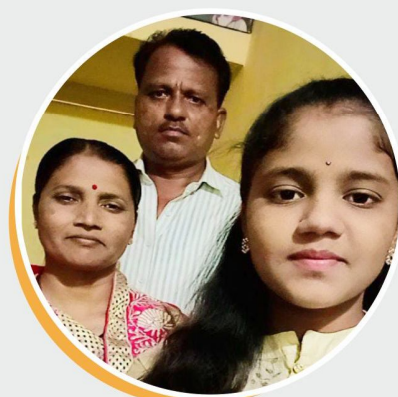


Himanush Katekhaye

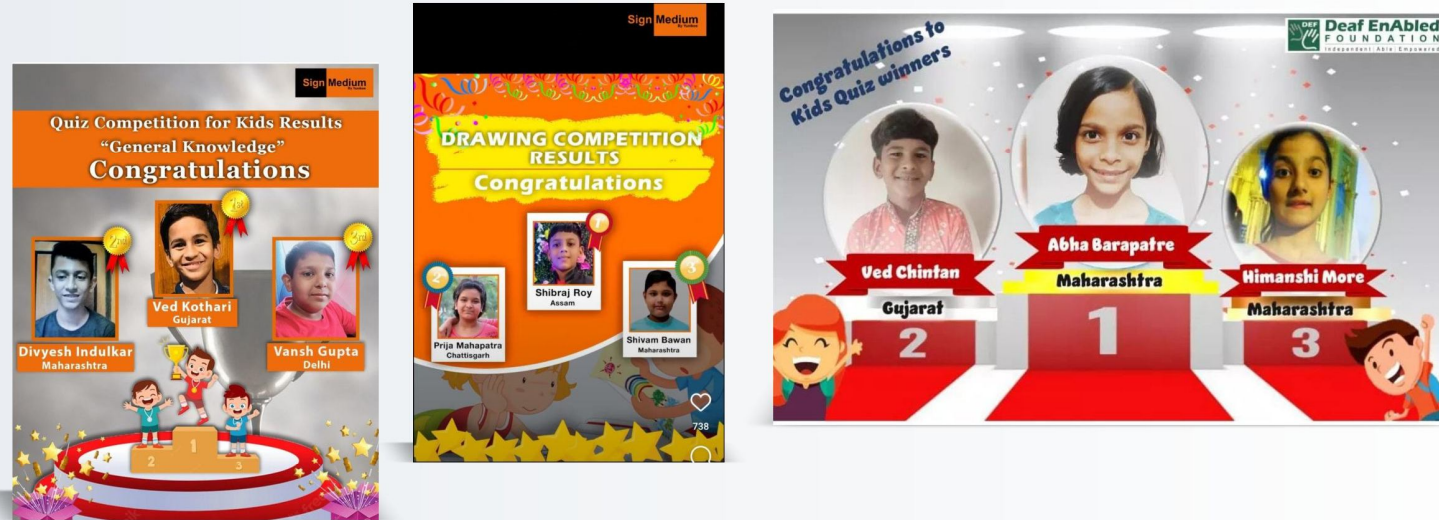

Orjet Foundation offers a number of personalised and skill-based short term online courses to empower young deaf adults such as Personal finance including investments, online banking and other online transactions (booking tickets, ordering food etc), computer literacy through MS Office, digital photography and professional video recording on a mobile phone and editing them using mobile apps and so on. With an increased focus on the Online Education for Deaf children and facing limited manpower resources at the same time, Orjet Foundation decided to partner with Sign Medium, a branch of Yuniquee to collaboratively conduct Orjet Foundation's above mentioned courses for deaf adults. During the year 2022-23, it has successfully trained over 60 deaf adults in different skill areas. This way, we hope to expand our outreach and help deaf community members to become skilled in managing their own needs independently in the contemporary world that is increasingly becoming digital.

Founder Trustee Personally Visits...



The Four of our deaf students belonged to one family based in Ahmedabad, Gujarat. Mrs. Taruna and Mr. Sanjay Soni, the deaf couple, have four deaf children viz. Aditya, Bhumi, Harshida, and Khushal. It was learnt that Mr. Sanjay works for a company that deal in imitation jewellery and together with his housewife Taruna, they looked after their four deaf children. Since they hailed from Ahmedabad, the same city our Founder Trustee Mr. Sarvesh Jain lives in, he decided to visit them personally and to inquire about their wellbeing. Looking at their own financial plight, Mr. Sarvesh Jain assured Orjet Foundation's full support for the educational development of their four children.

Awareness Programme for Hearing parents of Deaf children

Over 90% of deaf children are born to hearing parents who are unaware about raising deaf children successfully; who also have misconceptions about deafness and sign language need a proper orientation towards deafness, deaf people, their sign language and deaf culture. They also need to see Deaf Role Models (DRMs) to believe what their deaf children can become. In that context, Orjet Foundation conducted a seminar on awareness for hearing parents of deaf children at Chandrapur village of Wankaner district of Gujarat. Our dynamic local Deaf leader Mr. Aejaz Parasara led the seminar and guided the hearing parents about deafness, ISL and its role in the educational development of deaf children and how necessary it was for hearing parents to learn and converse with their deaf children in ISL.

Awareness and Empowerment of Deaf Communities on ISL based Education

In India, there are numerous deaf associations, registered or unregistered, operating at various levels: villages, districts, towns and cities. The purpose of majority of these associations has been to provide platform for meeting, celebrating events, participating in cultural programmes and sports. In order to create an awareness on the importance of ISL based education for themselves and their deaf children, Orjet Foundation's core expert team members Mr. Rajesh Ketkar and Mr. Manan Shah travelled places around India and presented at these deaf associations on various topics that concerned them, for example: Starting, funding, and managing an educational project for deaf youths. They helped local deaf leaders to understand how to analyse particular situation using SWOT analysis, how to overcome failures, and how to create fool-proof proposals and approach correct funding agencies for support. Mr. Rajesh and Mr. Manan also promoted the work of Orjet Foundation, explained its vision and educational activities for greater awareness and empowerment of young deaf adults and deaf children. They encouraged them to help other deaf children around them to join Orjet Foundation's ISL based online educational programmes for their overall development.



OUR ALLIES

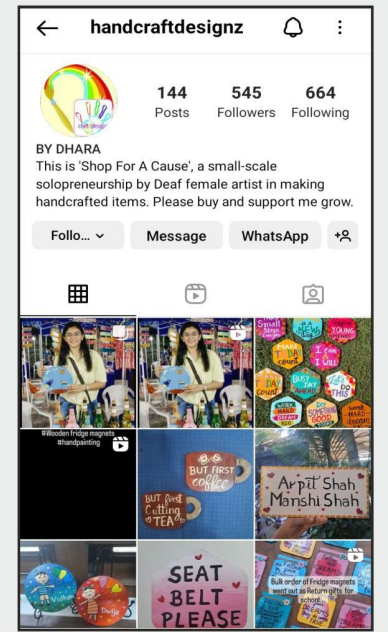
Mr. Manan Shah, the founder of IECGD (Inspiring, Educative, Creative Games for the Deaf) started the Instagram account in April 2021, with a purpose to educate and entertain deaf ISL users towards usage of authentic Indian Sign Language among themselves, both online and offline.

The prolonged lockdown and the 'Work From Home (WFH)' policy due to COVID – 19 pandemic had led Indian deaf youths using internet 24X7. During that time they had quickly picked up vocabulary of foreign sign languages from International deaf communities interconnected on various Social Media platforms which they followed; and used them in annoyingly excessive way in their day-to-day conversation among themselves.

Mr. Manan, an avid ISL user himself, wanted to save ISL from losing its charm by preventing young deaf ISL users to abuse vocabulary of foreign sign languages in the wrong way. He exploited social media platform to host Instagram LIVE shows to engage Indian deaf youths and children in creative and educative games using ISL which has been a huge hit. Till date, his IECGD project has 35.5k followers and has hosted a number of live shows together with Indian and foreign deaf leaders as guests. This way, he contributed to Orjet Foundation's popularity and success of its educational activities.



Mrs. Dhara Jain, housewife of founder trustee Mr. Sarvesh Jain and a successful Deaf art & craft artist herself, saw deaf children reaping huge benefits by participating in Orjet Foundation's ISL based educational programmes. She thought of reaching out to more poor deaf children in remote places and providing them opportunities to learn online at Orjet Foundation free of cost. She decided to exploit her artistic skills to sell her handicraft creations online only to remit her earnings to support Orjet Foundation's poor deaf children. Orjet Foundation team remains grateful to her for the same.



Resources

Online learning resources such as educational YouTube videos have immense potential to educate learners during self-study outside online class hours. There are thousands of useful educational videos on YouTube, however, almost all of them are inaccessible to deaf children. Orjet Foundation has created a library of educational resources (visual books and ISL videos) on its website (orjetfoundation.org) and it will keep adding subject knowledge videos presented in ISL to the library from time to time. These resources are available to all deaf children free of cost.
